C o u r t in Dearborn Heights in December 2 0 1 1 .



She was appointed by the court to the position by the Dearborn Heights City Council and was the youngest magistrate in the state of Michigan!

In her role as magistrate, she handles traffic violations and other small crimes. She also serves as the probation director, where she oversees the 20th District Court's probation department and plays an active role in preparing recommendations for sentencing of offenders placed under the court's supervision.

Magistrate Abraham, 36, has been practicing law since 2006 and received her Juris Doctorate from the University of Detroit Mercy School of Law. She received her undergraduate degree in 2003 from the University of Michigan-Dearborn in Finance and Marketing.

Magistrate Abraham is an active member of the Arab-American community and serves on the advisory board of the American-Arab Anti-Discrimination Committee and as board member of the Arab American Women's Business Council. She also serves on a number of non-profit boards such as HYPE athletics and Rotary Club.
