Behind the Mask: A Teacher's Story

Teacher: Ms. Nagat Mohamed Class: AVID/College Prep (7th/8th Grade) Tell me about your life at home? Family? Pets?



I'm married, and I have 4 kids. Mohamed is 19, Riam is 17, Jayda is 15, and my little one is 9 years old. I do have a pet kitten, and her name is Luna. We've had her for about a year and two months. I've been married for a very very long time. My kids are grown and I'm happy about that, hamdillah.

What do you do in your free time?

I love working out, you guys know that. I'm either at the gym, or I'm working out at home if I can't get to the gym. I love spending time with my mom and my sister, and if I'm not out with my mom and my sister, I'm spending time with my friends, and my family of course. Family is first.

Who do you go to the gym with?

I go by myself because I consider those 2 and a half hours my time. Even though I enjoy working out with people, that's my time to really just reflect and think. Sometimes I listen to podcasts and motivational speeches. I really really enjoy working out on my own. I'm not distracted and I get things done.

If you weren't a teacher, what would you want to do instead?

I think I would have loved to be a police officer. There's just something that irritates me when I hear someone did bad to someone or someone hurt someone. I'm a very nurturing person, but at the same time, I want justice for people who get hurt. So that's why I could see myself in that position. If I wasn't a police officer, I'd want to be something in the police force; like the CIA. If I weren't a teacher, another thing that I probably would've thought about was being a therapist. I feel like I'm a really open person and I listen, so a lot of people would call me and ask for my opinion. I'm also good at keeping things confidential and I do want to help.

Did you always want to be a teacher?

I've wanted to be a teacher since second grade. When I was younger, I would have my friends come to my house. I would be the teacher, and I would have all the books, I would ask all my teachers if they could give me the old books they didn't use, and we would play school in my basement. I just loved helping. As I got older, I wanted to please my dad and be a pharmacist, and I was going to do it for him, but I knew it just wasn't me.

What grades and subjects did you teach? What was your favorite and why?

I've always taught Elementary, I've been teaching for 20 years, this is my 21st. I taught 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and now 7th and 8th. 8th is my favorite, AVID is my favorite. I almost feel like I can expand your thinking in different ways, versus when I had to teach other grades where I had to follow something very very specific. I do follow the AVID curriculum, but I also have that flexibility of changing things around, which I love.

Behind the Mask: A Teacher's Story Continued

What is something that your students may not know about you?

When I was in first grade, I used to see a social worker. I was a selective mute, which was a person that does not speak to anyone unless they want to speak to them. I could go for a whole year without speaking. I really think it was because I was kind of intimidated by my teacher because back then they used to hit the kids and put masking tape on their mouths if they spoke too much. I was traumatized seeing her do that to other kids. And so I didn't talk for two years. A social worker would pull me out of class and ask me to talk to the puppets. I eventually opened up and got better.

What is your plan after retirement?

I wish to move to Florida with my family, next to the beach, and get a condo. If that doesn't happen, I'll probably work part time at a gym and volunteer my time with my family. I will be a good muslim and live nicely and peacefully.

Why did you choose to teach at Salina?

Remember how I told you guys there were two schools, here and a school in Detroit. They both called me and offered a position. I wasn't born and raised here but I'm Yemeni, and this is my community. What's better than teaching the kids that are just like you? I love seeing the yemeni kids grow up and be successful because like I said, you guys are our kids at the end of the day. Inshallah I never get placed anywhere else because I love our community. I feel like I teach with my sisters and brothers, and I teach my own kids.

What is the best advice you could give us students about life or school?

The best advice I could give you is to be honest with yourself. And what I mean by that is be who you are. Do not fake who you are, do not try to be someone that you're not. Be genuine, and be who you are, because the people that respect and love you won't mind. Be a good person, but do not play a role and pretend to be someone that you're not. Trust me, because later on, you won't be happy with who you are. That's the best advice that I could give anyone.

Who, dead or alive, would you say has had the greatest influence on you? My father, even though we had issues, he always motivated me to go and finish school. He always said "when I die I just want all of you to be able to protect yourself with your sword..your education is your sword". I respected him for that and that was very influential to me.



COVID-19 screening tool

Staff and visitors, if you answer "yes" to any of these questions, you must stay home from school today. Parents and guardians, if your child would answer yes to any of these questions, they must be kept home from school.

Question 1: Do you have any new, unusual or worsening symptoms listed in Boxes A and B below?

| Box A | Box B |

| Fever? (100.4°F or higher) Cough? Shortness of breath? Difficulty breathing? Loss of smell or taste? | Vomiting or diarrhea? Headache? Sore throat? Runny nose and/or congestion? Body aches and/or tiredness? |

If you answered "yes" in either box above, then stay home and consult your primary care doctor. If a doctor determines the symptoms are due to another diagnosis, or if COVID-19 is ruled out, you may return to school after at least 24 hours fever-free without the use of fever-reducing medicine and without vomiting.

Question 2: In the last 10 days have you been identified as a close contact of anyone who has had a positive COVID-19 diagnostic test? You may answer "No" if:

- It has been more than two weeks since you received the second dose of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine or one dose of the Johnson and Johnson vaccine
- Within the past three months you had a positive PCR test for COVID, unless the test was within the last 10 days.
- Ves No

If you answer "yes", then stay home to quarantine for at least 10 days from the last exposure to the close contact. In some situations, you may be able to return sooner with a negative COVID test. See our current quarantine guidelines. If symptoms appear, stay home and follow the current guidance for isolation. (See symptoms section above.)

Question 3: Have you returned from international travel in the last 10 days? You may answer ""No" if you had a negative COVID test (PCR or rapid) after returning to the United States.

If you answer "yes", then stay home until you have a COVID test and the results are negative.
